

How to get to St. Gallen Tourist Information: Detailed information for people with limited mobility

By public transportation

Good to know:

- Many trains are low-floor trains (you can board without steps).
- St.Gallen station is barrier-free. It has guide lines and elevators.
- There are two exits at the station:
 - There is an elevator at the west exit.
There are no guide lines here.
 - There is a ramp at the east exit.
There are guide lines in the underpass.
- Helpful apps: SBB Mobile, SBB Inclusive



From the train station to the tourist information office
(about a 10-minute walk, approx. 700–800 meters):

- Take the east exit. You will see a large clock with blue lettering in the station building (binary clock).



- Go straight through the bus station.

⚠ Caution: Buses and trams run here. There are also many pedestrians.



- Walk past Kornhausplatz square with the Lämmli fountain (on your right).



- Cross the street at the traffic light on the right. Then turn left at the next traffic light and immediately right.



- After 50 meters, you will see the sign "Tourist Information." Follow it to the left onto Vadianstrasse. This is where the pedestrian zone begins.

⚠ Caution: Cyclists are allowed to ride here..



- Walk 200 meters straight ahead. Then cross a street (without traffic lights). From here on, the ground is cobbled.



- Turn into the first alley on the right, then after 20 meters turn left, then after 50 meters turn right into Bankgasse.



- The tourist information office is in the last building on the left. The entrance is in the corner of the building.



By car

Good to know:

- The Tourist Information Office is located in the pedestrian zone. Access to the building by car is not permitted (shuttle service allowed).
- The old town has a mixture of asphalt and cobblestone streets.
- The route is mostly flat with only slight inclines.

Parking:

- There are parking spaces for people with limited mobility.
- You can find an overview on the ginto app. Download it now.

Entrance to the Tourist Information Office

- Use the entrance at the corner of the building between Klosterplatz and Gallusplatz.
- The entrance is at ground level, with no steps.
- There is an automatic sliding glass door.
